The FCCLA Community Service national peer education program guides students to **develop, plan, carry out, and evaluate projects to improve the quality of life in their communities.** Through their projects, members experience character development and improve their critical and creative thinking, interpersonal communication, practical knowledge, and career preparation. Youth leaders learn more about themselves, others, and the world so that they can make a difference now and in the future

Units:

- **Learn** - Members explore personal values, ethics, and ethical decision-making while evaluating their community needs.
- **Lead** - Members learn how to use their leadership skills to serve their community and how to transfer those servant leadership skills to the workplace.
- **Serve** - Members are introduced to the critical role community partnerships and advocacy play in serving the needs of others while also developing their own community-based service.
- High School Award – **\$1,000**
- Middle School Award – **\$1,000**
- Runner-Up Award – **\$500**
