INVESTING



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Investing your money in different organizations can be a great way to both save and earn interest on your money. But investing does come with some **risk** and should be discussed with a trusted adult before you start. When investing into an organization or stocks, you could either come out with **more money** that you put in or you could come out with a **loss** of money.

A good way to start investing your money is investing it into a **High Yield Savings Account (HYSA)**. A HYSA offers a **higher interest** rate than most savings accounts. As always, make sure to **read the terms and conditions thoroughly** before investing as they may have high minimum balances and/or annual fees.

The perfect way to start learning about investing and saving your money is starting with a **mock stock account like Investopedia**. This can allow you to learn more about different investment strategies while also minimizing the risk of losing your money.
